Each of the elementary schools offers programs for students in grades one to five.

Parent/Student Information

Parent-Teacher Conferences

Scheduled dates of official parent-teacher conferences are listed on the calendar pages in this publication. However, parents are encouraged to contact their children's teachers or guidance counselors when they feel a need to discuss their child's progress. Individual conferences may be arranged by making an appointment through the elementary school office or secondary guidance office. Please visit the Parent Portal on Infinite Campus for current information.

Report Cards

Report cards are issued at the end of each quarter of the academic year. Elementary report cards will be distributed at parent/teacher conferences. Secondary report cards are typically mailed home.

Procedures for Solving Parent Concerns

If you have any concerns pertaining to your child's educational well being and/or academic performance at their school:

- Contact the staff member and schedule a conference.
- If the conference fails to satisfactorily resolve the issue, contact the building principal and/ or designated assistant principal to schedule a conference.
- If the issue remains unresolved, contact the Assistant Superintendent for that division (Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction, Data Analysis and Accountability; Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations; Assistant Superintendent of Family and Student Support Services or Assistant Superintendent for Athletics, Physical Education for Health and Wellness, and Security) who then will gather the facts and attempt to resolve the problem.

Education Law § 807 Fire and Emergency Drills

It shall be the duty of the principal or other person in charge of every public or private school or educational institution within the state, other than colleges or universities, to instruct and train the pupils by means of drills, so that they may in a sudden emergency be able to respond appropriately in the shortest possible time and without confusion or panic.

Such drills shall be held at least twelve times in each school year, eight of which required drills shall be held between September 1st and December 31st of each such year. Eight of all such drills shall be evacuation drills, four of which shall be through use of the fire escapes on buildings where fire escapes are provided or through the use of identified secondary means of egress. Four of all such required drills shall be lock-down drills.

Drills shall be conducted at different times of the school day. Pupils shall be instructed in the procedure to be followed in the event that a fire occurs during the lunch period or assembly, provided however, that such additional instruction may be waived where a drill is held during the regular school lunch period or assembly. Four additional drills shall be held in each school year during the hours after sunset and before sunrise in school buildings in which students are provided with sleeping accommodations. At least two additional drills shall be held during summer school in buildings where summer school is conducted, and one of such drills shall be held during the first week of summer school.

For any Dignity for All Students Act (DASA) concerns, please contact your child's Principal.

To have an effective parent-teacher conference:

- Be prepared by looking over your child's classwork and homework.
- Make a list of questions or concerns and send them to the teacher ahead of time—this will also help the teacher to prepare.
- Arrive on time.
- Raise your most recent concerns first.
- · Listen carefully.
- · Ask questions.
- Keep in touch with the teacher to set a SMART (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, and Time-bound) goal plan for your child.

Student Records

Parents/guardians and students over 18 years of age have the right of access to records, files, documents and other materials containing information directly related to their children. Parents/guardians or eligible students should submit a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect.

Non-custodial parents may receive their child's educational information if they make an annual request to do so, unless the District receives a court order or other legally binding documentation prohibiting the release of information.

Parent Participation

Parents are welcome to become active participants in PTAs at the elementary schools; PTA at the Middle School or PTSA at the High School.

Testing New Entrant Screening

In addition to registering your child for kindergarten a screening is administered to measure the child's abilities. This will provide the District with a profile of your child in order to assist in determining their kindergarten placement.

Norm-Referenced Tests

In addition to tests that are developed by the classroom teacher, children also take certain standardized or "norm-referenced" tests to assess their strengths and weaknesses in mastering the full-range of learning appropriate to each grade level.

NYS Testing Program

All students in grades three through eight in New York State take the Common Core English Language Arts test and the Mathematics test in the Spring.

The tests require students not only to show basic skills in English and Mathematics, but also to apply the knowledge and skills they have learned. Students read passages, answer comprehension questions and complete writing exercises on the English language arts tests. They solve Mathematics problems and demonstrate understanding of concepts and applications on the Mathematics tests.

Students in grades four and eight take a state assessment in Science that consists of a performance test (laboratory component) and a written test on science skills and content. All exams scheduled by New York State have been listed on this calendar.

New York State English as a Second Language Achievement Test (NYSESLAT)

The New York State English as a Second Language Achievement Test (NYSESLAT) is designed to annually assess the English language proficiency of all English Language Learners/Multilingual Learners (ELLs/ MLLs) enrolled in Grades K–12 in New York State schools. The test provides the State and schools with important information about the English language development of ELLs/MLLs, and is part of the State's compliance with federal laws that mandate the annual assessing and monitoring of the English language proficiency of all ELLs/MLLs. The results of the 2019 NYSESLAT will drive the provision of ELL/MLL services in Bilingual Education and English as a New Language programs for the 2019–20 school year as prescribed in Commissioner's Regulations Part 154-2 and 154-3.

SCHOOL BREAKFAST, LUNCH, AND DINNER PROGRAM

Parents and Educators Need to Know

Test results provide the student, teacher and parent with a report of individual student strengths and weaknesses in a variety of skill areas. The New York State Testing Program provides our schools with data that helps to assess the instructional programs

that students receive. They are also used to identify both students and schools that need to improve performance under state and federal accountability standards.

Emergency School Closings

SCHOOL CANCELLATIONS, DELAYS AND EMERGENCY EARLY DISMISSALS

The decision to close schools due to the weather or for other emergency conditions is made by the Superintendent in consultation with our weather service, the Director of Buildings and Grounds, and other school Superintendents in surrounding school districts. When a closing or delay is announced, it affects all schools and programs of Poughkeepsie City School District, unless the closing or delay is due to an emergency situation specific to a particular building. Automated calls will be made by the School Messenger System as soon as possible.

EMERGENCY EARLY DISMISSALS

When there is an early dismissal, if the situation allows, High School and Middle School students will be released first and then Elementary students. This ensures that the older siblings of Elementary students arrive home before younger siblings. Parents are reminded to make sure that all school-age children know what to do in case of early dismissal. Parents are required to complete and submit to the District an Emergency Dismissal Plan.

CANCELLATION OF AFTER-SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Sometimes it may be necessary to cancel after-school activities although school has been in session for the full day. Information about cancellation of after-school activities will be announced on the radio stations and through phone calls to parents of affected children.

At the high school level, all students must now take and score satisfactorily on Regents examinations in the following subjects: English, Mathematics, Global History, U.S. History and Government, a Living Environment Science course and a Physical Setting Science course. A more comprehensive explanation of diploma requirements is available through the High School Guidance Office at (845) 451-4910.

Other Standardized Tests

The College Boards Scholastic Aptitude Tests (SAT) and the American College Tests (ACT) are required for admission to many colleges. The SAT is given in Verbal and Math sections; achievement tests cover English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science and Foreign Languages.

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT) and the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test will be administered in October. This combined examination is recommended for juniors. Tenth grade students may take the test for practice. The American College Test will be given at Poughkeepsie High School. For more information, contact the Poughkeepsie High School Guidance Office at (845) 451-4910.

New York State Testing Program Additional Information

If your child is in Elementary School and you wish to find out additional information about the New York State Testing Program, call for an appointment with your child's Principal.

If you wish additional information about the tests administered at the Middle School and High School level, or for course requirements for graduation, call for an appointment with your child's Guidance Counselor.

Advanced Placement and College Credit Offerings

PCSD offers Advanced Placement (AP) courses in a variety of subject areas. These AP courses are available to qualifying students at the high school level, as well as dual credit college courses in conjunction with Dutchess Community College.

Music Instruction

General music instruction is provided for all students in Clinton, Krieger, Morse, Warring, ELC and Poughkeepsie Middle School. Students who wish to play a musical instrument may receive lessons. Band, chorus and/or orchestra opportunities are offered throughout the Elementary, Middle, and High School years.

Student Activities

Poughkeepsie Schools offer a wide range of extracurricular activities and athletic programs including baseball, softball, basketball, crew, football, golf, soccer, swimming, tennis and wrestling. The Poughkeepsie Middle School is equipped with a six-lane, 25-yard swimming pool.

IMMUNIZATION

Students are required by New York State Public Health Code to receive a series of immunizations in order to be eligible to attend school. New York State (NYS) Public Health Law Section 2164 and New York Codes, Rules and Regulations (NYCRR) Title 10, Subpart 66-1 require every student entering or attending public, private or parochial school in New York State (NYS) to be immune to diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, measles, mumps, rubella, poliomyelitis, hepatitis B, and varicella in accordance with Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommendations.

Effective September 1, 2016, students entering or attending grades 7 and 12 in (NYS) must also be vaccinated against meningococcal disease in accordance with ACIP recommendations. Every child in day care, Head Start, nursery school or Pre-Kindergarten in NYS must be immune to diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, measles, mumps, rubella, poliomyelitis, hepatitis B, varicella, Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib), and pneumococcal disease.

Nonmedical exemptions to school vaccination requirements have ended for children attending day care and pre-K through 12th grade in New York State. This includes all public, private, and religious schools. Religious exemptions are no longer allowed.

Children with nonmedical exemptions must now be vaccinated to attend or remain in school. Students who already have all required school vaccinations, and students with a valid medical exemption from a physician, are not affected by this change.

All required New York State immunizations records are due in the health office by September 18, 2019. Failure to comply with New York State requirements can lead to your child being excluded from school as of September 19, 2019. Any Questions in regard to this can be directed to your child's school nurse.

Parent/Student Information

Central Registration

Families who are enrolling their students for the first time must go to the Central Registration Office, located in the Poughkeepsie Middle School, 55 College Avenue, weekdays between 9:00 am and 2:00 pm.

Entrance Requirements

Students reaching 4 years of age on or before December 1st may enter pre-Kindergarten in September; however, seats are limited. Students reaching 5 years of age on or before December 1st may enter Kindergarten in September. Students who reach the age of 6 during the school year are required to attend school at the start of classes in September.

Documents Required for Admission

- •Birth Certificate or other evidence of proof of age
- Evidence of family address in the City of Poughkeepsie
- •A physician's certificate and evidence of required immunization

Medication

Before any medication may be administered to or by any student during school hours, the written request of the parent and the written order of the prescribing physician must be submitted to the school nurse. All medication must be administered in the health office by the school nurse, parent, or with the parent's permission, the student himself/herself.

Accident and Illness

A student who becomes ill or injured is referred to the school nurse, who functions under the guidance of the school physician. In the event of an accident first aid may be administered. The parent will be called when a student must leave school due to illness or injury and will be asked to provide transportation for the child. The family physician or, if not available, the school physician, may be contacted by the nurse if medical attention is indicated.

NOTICE TO PARENTS REGARDING PESTICIDE APPLICATIONS

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, requires public and non-public elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year. Poughkeepsie City School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. Certain applications are not subject to prior notification requirements: a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application; anti-microbial products; nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children; boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate; the application of EPA designated biopesticides; the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25; and the use of aerosol products with directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects, including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets. If you would like to receive 48-hour notification of pesticide applications that are scheduled to occur in your school, or for further information, please contact the Director of Facilities at (845) 451-4996.

School Attendance

school regularly. If your child is not in school he/ she cannot learn.

Legal absence from school may be granted for the following reasons: personal illness, illness or death in the family, religious observance, required court appearance, approved college visits, military obligations, or such other reasons as may be approved by the Commissioner of Education.

A note signed by the parent or guardian explaining the cause of the absence must be presented upon the child's return to avoid the school recording an illegal absence. In addition, parents are asked to make every effort to notify the school by telephone on the day of the child's absence. If a child is absent for more than three days, parents may expect a phone call from the health office.

All absences, lateness of more than ten minutes, or early departures (excused or unexcused) are counted on a student's attendance record. If a student does not attend at least 85% of all classes in a course and does not complete all make up academic work, he/she will not receive credit for that course and will not be allowed to sit for the final exam. Parents will be contacted in all instances of absences which are not excused.

School Hours and Attendance

School hours vary and are listed in school handbooks. New York State Education Law requires each child from 6 to 16 years of age to attend school. However, our District has made a true commitment to provide students with many opportunities to

It is important to make sure your child attends remain in school in order to earn a high school diploma and to move on to future endeavors that would make them productive citizens.

Tardiness

A note signed by the parent or guardian explaining the cause of the child's late arrival is required.

Release of Pupils During School Hours

Pupils may be excused by the principal before the end of the school day only when it is for a purpose related to their best interests. Requests for early release must be made in writing by the student's parent or quardian. The request must specify to whom the child is to be released.

Visitors

All visitors to a school building are required to: present identification, sign-in, and report to the main office or building greeter upon arrival.

Homebound Instruction

Individual instruction will be provided to students who are confined to home or the hospital for at least two weeks due to a physical disability, illness, injury or psychiatric cause. Applications for homebound instruction should state the nature of the illness, the possible length of absence from school, include a physician's recommendation and be approved by the building principal. The Superintendent may also recommend homebound instruction pending and/or following a suspension hearing.
