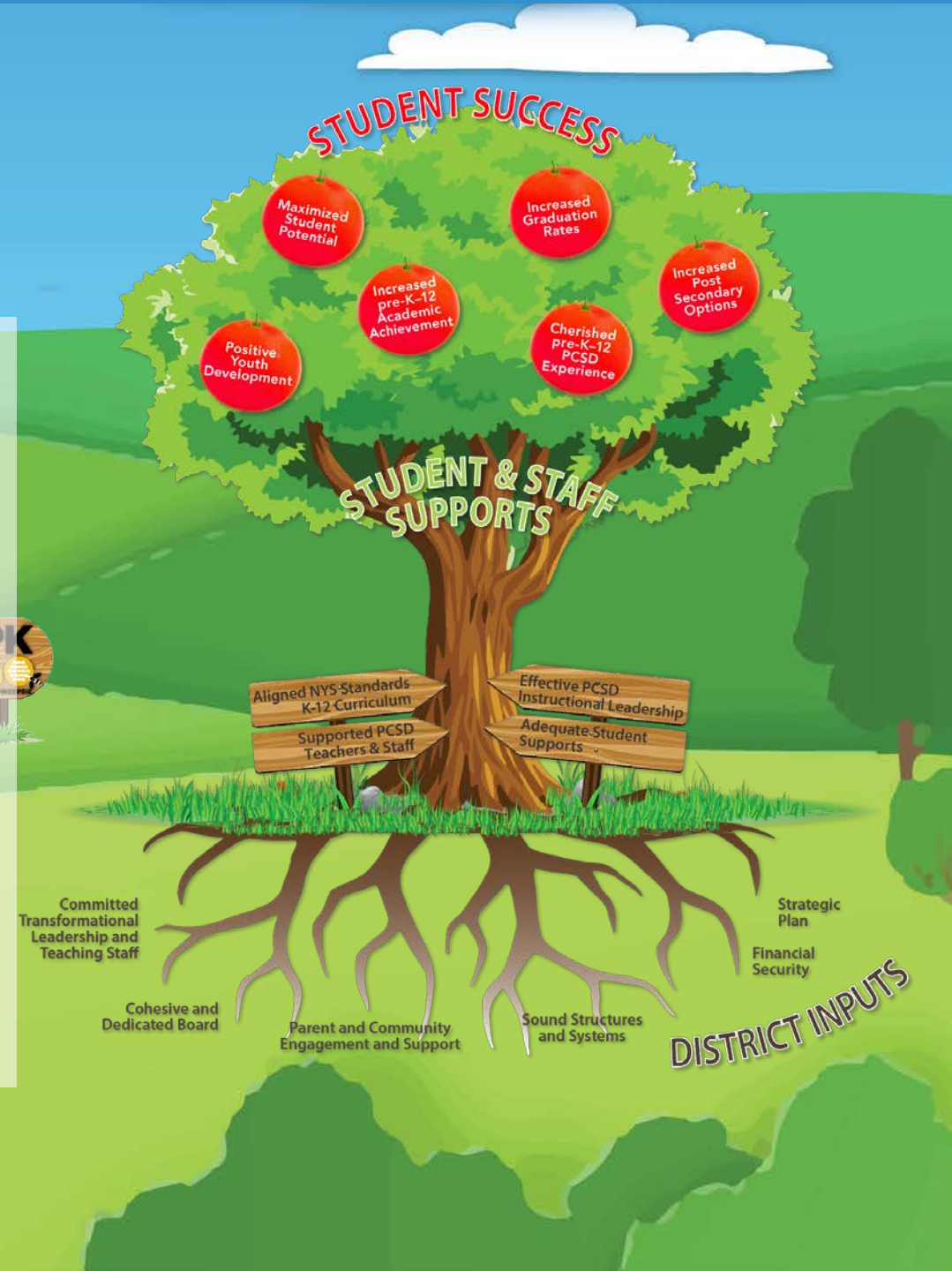


# Achieving Student Success Through Community Partnerships
