### THE COMMUNITY

Known as "The Queen City of the Hudson", the City of Poughkeepsie sits on the east bank of the Hudson River and features the historic Walkway over the Hudson. The area is recognized for its historical sights, beauty, entertainment and nearby colleges and universities. The racial makeup of the City was 52.8% White, 35.7% Black or African American, 10.6% Hispanic or Latino, 1.6% Asian, 0.4% Native American and 9.4% other. Those living below the poverty line made up 22.7% of the total population.

Employment is centered around education (including higher education), health care, technology, retail and hospitality.

Nearby colleges and universities include Vassar College, Dutchess Community College, SUNY College at New Paltz, American Culinary Institute and Marist College.

Vassar Brothers Medical Center is located in the City while nearby health facilities include the MidHudson Regional Hospital, Northern Dutchess Hospital and Kingston Hospital.

Nearby Stewart Airport offers multiple options for domestic and international travel. Albany, LaGuardia, JFK and Newark airports are all within two hours by car and offer options for travel around the globe.
