

### **2019 Summer School Registration**

PHS Guidance Counselors will be doing all summer advisement at Poughkeepsie High School from 9-11 am on Tuesday, July 2. The Summer School Principal will then process the registration. Summer School classes are free to all students of Poughkeepsie. Anyone registering a student must show a picture I.D. or other proof of identification, a filled-out Emergency Contact Card, and the Handbook cover letter. The application must be signed by the Principal and the Parent/Guardian to register a student for Summer School. Students registering for Regents Exams, RCT or August Regents (for students who failed the Regents in the past two years and must retake the exam) must provide the same I.D. information. If a course is designated as Regents, the exam automatically comes with the course. Physics, Chemistry and Algebra 2 Regents are not given in August. \*\*Grade level is as of June 1, 2019 not September 1, 2019.

## **CLASS PARTICIPATION/ATTENDANCE**

Class participation grades are based on the quality of in-class-student-performance and not on mere attendance. Students must be prepared and understand the reason why they are going to Summer School. This is their second chance. There are no “excused absences” such as illness, doctor appointments, special events, vacations, sporting events camps or court appearances, etc. Students are expected to participate in all activities for Summer School. All assignments must be submitted to the teacher as directed. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in an appropriate grade point reduction as determined by the instructor.

No assignments will be accepted after the last day of classes.

## **ABSENCE/TARDINESS**

Students missing 3 days in any class will be removed from the program and denied credit due to the lack of attendance, even if it is for a vacation or illness.

**Four (4)** tardies of less than 5 minutes is the equivalent of one (1) absence.

**Two (2)** tardies if greater than 5 minutes is the equivalent of one (1) absence.

Any lateness greater than 25 minutes is the equivalent of one (1) absence. Students who are late are to report to their designated area to get a pass.

## **2019 ACADEMIC SUMMER SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS**

One act of insubordination towards staff members or any behavior disruptive to the educational process will result in removal from the program and may result in a suspension during the 2019-2020 school year. This document serves as the warning. There will not be a second chance.

The District Code of Conduct of Poughkeepsie High School is to be followed during Summer School. Please review the Code of Conduct before classes begin.

Students are to be in class on time and must participate in each class. Grades will be based on attendance, positive classroom participation, assignments, projects and homework.

Students are to dress according to the District Code of Conduct. Students who are dressed inappropriately will be asked to change or be sent home.

Cell phones, I-pods, or any electronic devices should be turned off and placed out of sight during classes. Except in the case of an emergency, telephone messages will not be delivered.

Fighting will not be tolerated and you will be removed from Summer School and not allowed back and may result in a suspension of five days.

Possession of weapons of any type will not be tolerated and you will be removed from Summer School and not allowed back. This would result in a five day suspension/Superintendent’s Hearing and criminal charges may also be filed.

Smoking and alcohol are prohibited in the school building and on school grounds.
