Poughkeepsie City School District Schools Model

Early Learning: Prenatal to Preschool

- Implementation of the Children's Cabinet Early Childhood Report






Family Needs Assessment Results




Food Insecurity (lack of consistent access to enough healthy food for self/family):




Unstable Housing (difficulty paying rent, staying with friends/relatives, moving often):




Medical Support (finding insurance or medical, dental, and mental health services):




Employment/Financial Assistance (finding/applying to jobs, making ends meet):










