Letter to Parents for School Meal Programs Special Provision Options (Provision 2 Non-Base Year & Community Eligibility Provision)

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. Poughkeepsie City School District offers healthy meals every school day. The Poughkeepsie City School District is a CEP District where each student is eligible for free meals. The cost of a second meal for elementary level students is \$1.50 for breakfast and \$2.50 for lunch and dinner. The cost of a second meal for secondary level students is \$1.75 for breakfast and \$3.00 for lunch and dinner.
