Fundraiser set to expand PHS football

A major fundraising campaign to expand the Poughkeepsie High School football program is underway as part of recent Poughkeepsie City School District efforts to expand athletics, extracurricular opportunities, and arts education.

Over the last three years, the district has installed new scoreboards in the gymnasium at PHS, refurbished the PHS tennis courts, made investments in the PMS pool, and refinished gymnasium floors at ELC and Krieger. The district has also created opportunities for students with exceptionalities to compete in competitive basketball and bowling and established a flag football team for female athletes.

Through the support of the Poughkeepsie Public Schools Foundation and Community Foundations of the Hudson Valley, Pioneer Pride - a group primarily composed of Poughkeepsie High School alumni - is raising funds to supplement and expand the football program. Pioneer Pride believes that quality athletic programs enrich educational experiences and provide many positive youth development characteristics including

- Teamwork.
- Physical and mental well-being.
- Respect for one's self and others.
- Socialization skills.
- Pride in one's physical appearance.

Pioneer Pride says that a well-established program can provide our students with college scholarship opportunities and potentially lead to professional careers in athletics as a player, in sports medicine, in sports management, or other related fields. Team sports help enhance a student's competence on and off the playing field, self-worth, academic skills, body perception, empathy and awareness of others' positive attributes, communication, ability to listen, and the ability to plan methodically in the pursuit of goals.

Library debuts new catalog, learning tablets

The Poughkeepsie Public Library District (PPLD) recently published its January & February 2024 editions of "The Rotunda," a bimonthly publication offering descriptions and dates of programs and services accessible to the community that promotes lifelong learning, literacy, and reading.

This issue of "The Rotunda" announces Vega, the new online catalog for all Mid-Hudson Library System member libraries. The new system allows patrons to place holds and renewals, check reading levels, create and share lists, provide an option to save reading histories, and more. The issue also announces the availability of bilingual early-learning tablets that are loaded with early-learning activities including science, technology, reading, engineering, art, music, and math. Most activities are in English and Spanish but several are in French, Italian, German, Russian, and Chinese. The devices are easy to use and ideal for all learning styles (auditory, visual, tactile, and kinesthetic).
